I have a picture in my mind of you as a boy racing next to Jewish prisoners and handing them washed vegetables to eat. I felt horrified to learn that three-quarters of your cousins died in concentration camps and scared for you as I read how you moved from place to place during World War II.

Now, I realize where Oren's love of soccer originated. A couple of years ago I read a touching novel called, *The Dovekeepers*, about Masada. As you mentioned in your autobiography the inhabitants took their own lives instead of allowing the Romans to invade. To me, this was a noble act on a mass scale and I can see why you would want your children to learn about their heritage by visiting this holy site. I can also see how the entire soccer team, including non-Jews, would be moved by the story you told them at Masada. Effy, what happened there and what happened to you and your family is heart-wrenching and deserves to be remembered.

I've always wondered about your business dealings. Forgive me, but whenever I hear a person is engaged in importing/exporting or "foreign transactions" I immediately think of clandestine meetings were money is exchanged yet not reported for tax purposes.
